## FALL CLEAN UP TIME.

Again this Fall, the City's Department of Public Works will provide free pick-up service for yard rakings, brush, small tree limbs, etc. **DO NOT USE BAGS OF ANY TYPE**



The dates for the clean-up are **Monday, October 22<sup>nd</sup> through Friday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>.**

**NOTHING IS TO BE PLACED ON THE EDGE OF STREETS BEFORE OCTOBER 21<sup>st</sup>.** If anything is placed before October 20<sup>th</sup>, the property owner will be cited, not warned. If you currently have fall clean-up debris on the street, it must be moved on your property and not in the grass area between the sidewalk and the street, OR it may be taken to the "Eastern Avenue disposal area" located between E. Lincoln Avenue and Vanyea Road, which is for **City residents only**. This site is monitored by cameras.

Refuse must be out by 7:00 a.m. October 22<sup>nd</sup> on **the edge of all streets, not in alleys, ditches or on grassy areas**. We ask your cooperation in separating leaves into one pile and brush & small tree limbs into another. This makes the pick-up and disposal process easier for crews. If not separated, the City cannot guarantee their pick-up. The City **cannot and will not** accept garbage, household trash, appliances of any kind, tin, metal, building materials, or items too heavy for one person to lift.

**GRASS or LEAVES IN PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP!**

## SNOW & ICE REMOVAL FROM SIDEWALK REQUIRED

The owners of any property in certain areas are required by City Ordinance to keep sidewalks clear of snow and ice. The areas which are included in the snow & ice removal Ordinance are listed as follows:

- Huron Street from Mackinaw Avenue to Locust Street
- Main Street from First Street to the South City Limits
- Water Street from State Street to Elm Street
- Mackinaw Avenue from Clinton Street to Main Street
- State Street from Huron Street to "F" Street
- Backus Street from Huron Street to Main Street
- Division Street from Dresser Street to Water Street
- Elm Street from Huron Street to Water Street
- Pine Street from Huron Street to Main Street
- Locust Street from Huron Street to Main Street



These sidewalks have been identified as high foot traffic areas and, as such, removal of snow & ice is required by Ordinance in order to insure public safety and limit property owner and public liability. The City of Cheboygan does provide snow removal services within this area, but this does not dismiss the requirement of the property owner to be sure that the sidewalk is clear in the event that the City is unable to keep the sidewalks clear in a timely manner.

**DO NOT PILE SNOW IN RIGHT-OF-WAY, ON SIDEWALKS OR IN BERM AREA (BETWEEN CURB & SIDEWALK).**

*If you are a new property owner within the City of Cheboygan, the U.S. Postal Service now requires that your mailbox be moved adjacent to the sidewalk [if there is one] or at the edge of the street. The City of Cheboygan cautions property owners to obtain a Miss Dig before moving their mailbox to ensure that no infrastructure will be harmed. Also, if your mailbox is now placed near the street, the City of Cheboygan cannot be responsible for damage done by winter snowplowing. ## WATER/SEWER EMERGENCIES

If you experience a water or sewer emergency during normal business hours, please call 627-2582.

Should you experience a water or sewer emergency **after normal business hours, or on a weekend or holiday**, you may dial **290-2900** to reach an employee of the Department of Public Works.

Please remember that this system is for emergency situations, not for general information that can be obtained during normal working hours.



## “Let Water Run and Water Service Freezing Policy” - Effective October 25, 2005

The City of Cheboygan will allow a “Let Water Run Credit” for those water/sewer customers who properly notify the City that they will be running their water over the winter months to avoid freeze-ups of their water service. Proper notification shall be in writing to the water/sewer billing department. The City will keep a record of the yearly lists subject to the City’s “Records Retention Policy.”

If the water service freezes between the water main and the “curb stop” or outside the water meter pit, the City shall correct the situation at its sole expense. If the meter freezes, the City shall thaw the service one time, any subsequent thawing shall be at a rate of \$40.00 per occasion and added to the customer’s next water/sewer billing.

If water service freezes on the building side of the “curb stop” or outside the meter pit, the City will have no responsibility in the matter. The City may assist on a labor, equipment, material and overhead basis if the customer agrees to pay the total expense.

The water/sewer billing clerk shall issue a “Let Water Run Credit” for all customers on the City “Let Water Run List” on the next billing that is based on an **actual reading** of the customer’s water meter. The amount of the credit will be based on the **previous year actual meter read** billed amount.

The City of Cheboygan reserves the right at any time, to modify, revise, amend, terminate or otherwise change the City’s Let Water Run and Water Service Freezing Policy.

## SECOND METER READ REQUESTS

When a water/sewer bill is questioned and a second meter read is requested, there will be no charge. If an error is discovered it will be corrected by the City staff. If there is no error, the customer will be required to pay the original bill. During the next 24-month period, if a second read is requested and there is no error, the customer will then be liable for a \$10.00 charge.

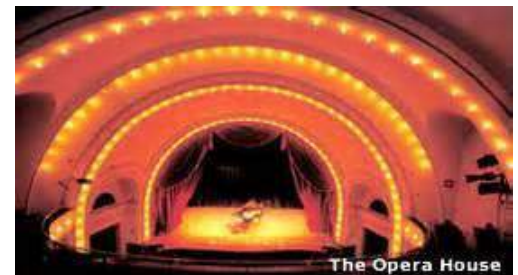

## BLIGHT ORDINANCE REMINDERS FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

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*The following is a summary of those sections of the City Ordinances which address blight violations and subject property owners to enforcement actions. This summary was prepared by the City's Blight Committee. It represents those areas within the City Ordinances which the Committee deems most important at this time but should not be considered a total list. Questions about the following should be directed to the Cheboygan Department of Public Safety.*

### **GRASS AND NOXIOUS WEEDS**

Chapter 95, Sec. 95.04 of the City Ordinances (Grass and Noxious Weeds) requires that property owners keep their lawns and property neat and trimmed throughout the growing season. Penalties for noncompliance may result in the City trimming and placing a bill for this on the tax roll.

### **INOPERABLE VEHICLES**

Chapter 94 prohibits owners, tenants or managers of private property from accumulating on private property any motor vehicle which is not in operating condition, is not licensed, or is not insured unless the property with certain exceptions for recreational vehicles, historical vehicles, and licensed construction vehicles used on a seasonal basis. If you believe a vehicle is exempted you should check with the City.

### **BLIGHTED EXTERIOR AND MAINTENANCE**

Chapter 95, Section 95.06, requires every owner and operator of property to comply with the following minimum requirements: All exterior property areas shall be properly maintained in a clean and sanitary condition, free from debris, brush, severed tree limbs, rubbish or garbage, physical hazards, rodent harborage and infestation; storage or placement of junk refuse or other objects, including, but not limited to, campers, trailers, lawnmowers, snowmobiles, tractors, motorcycles, boats, and others items not having been used recently for their original intended purpose in the right-of-way, yard, front porch or outside area exposed to the view of neighbors or the general public is prohibited, unless a temporary permit is issued by the City Manager.

### **BLIGHTED STRUCTURE OR BUILDING**

Chapter 95, Section 95.06 (A). It is prohibited to maintain a blighted structure or building which is defined as any dwelling, garage, accessory or outbuilding, or any factory, shop, store, office building, warehouse, or any other structure or part of a structure which:

- (a) Because of fire, wind, other natural disaster, or physical deterioration, is no longer habitable as a dwelling or useful for the purpose for which it was originally intended; or
- (b) Is partially completed and which is not presently being constructed under an existing, valid building permit issued by or under the authority of the city; or
- (c) Is not structurally sound, weather-tight, waterproof or vermin-proof; or
- (d) Is not covered by a water resistant paint or other waterproof covering so as to protect said structure from the adverse effects of the elements or from physical deterioration; or
- (e) Which causes or tends to cause devaluation of the subject property or other adjacent or nearby properties in the area due to neglect.

95.06 (B) further defines blight as a building which displays three or more of the following conditions:

- (1) Deteriorating roof; and/or
- (2) Siding off and/or damaged; and/or
- (3) Broken and/or deteriorating windows; and/or
- (4) Unfinished exterior; and/or
- (5) Collapsing porch or deck; and/or
- (6) Scaffolding unless associated with current building permit; and/or
- (7) Cracked and broken foundations/chimneys which constitute a structural or health hazard unless such structure is in the course of construction in accordance with a valid building permit issued by the city and unless such construction is completed within a reasonable time; and/or
- (8) Is partially completed and which is not presently being constructed under an existing, valid building permit issued by or under the authority of the City.

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### **Brush/Yard Waste**

Brush and yard waste shall not be put out on the curb until the dates published by the City. [See page 1] **NOTHING IS TO BE PLACED ON THE EDGE OF STREETS BEFORE OCTOBER 21<sup>st</sup>.** If anything is placed before October 21<sup>st</sup>, the property owner will be cited, not warned. If you currently have fall clean-up debris on the street, it must be moved on your property and not in the grass area between the sidewalk and the street. Any brush that needs to be disposed of before the dates set by the City shall be taken by the property owner to the drop off site on Eastern Avenue between E. Lincoln Avenue and Vanyea Road – 2<sup>nd</sup> gate on right hand side of road from Vanyea Road. This drop off is for City residents only and is monitored by cameras.
