WATER/SEWER EMERGENCIES

If you experience a water or sewer emergency during normal business hours, please call 627-2582. Should you experience a water or sewer emergency after normal business hours or on a weekend or holiday, the City staff is committed to providing emergency response. To provide that response, you may dial 290-2900 to reach an employee of the Department of Public Works. Please remember that this system is for emergency situations, not for general information that can be obtained during normal working hours.

WATER SHUT-OFF INFORMATION

Customers who have their water shut off and have to have Department of Public Works personnel restore service will be charged a \$40.00 Turn On Fee. This will include seasonal customers, non-payment customers and anyone discontinuing service for a period of 30 days or more.

EXPERIENCING A

Call the City at 627-2582 first before calling your plumber to find out whether or not your problem is the responsibility of the City. If you call your plumber first, the City will not be responsible for any costs.

PERMITS REQUIRED FOR WORK IN STREET RIGHTS-OF-WAY



Anyone planning to perform any type of work within a City street right-of-way **must** secure a Permit from the City of Cheboygan's Department of Public Works. Work requiring a Permit within a street right-of-way includes patch work, culvert installation, curb, sidewalk or driveway repair, tree or shrub planting or any other type of work within the street right-of-way. Please contact Jason L. Karmol, Director, Department of Public Works, at 627-2592, if you plan work in the street right-of-way or have questions concerning street rights-of-way.



Grass & Weed Notice

Property owners, residential & business, are required to cut the right-of-way (berm area), as well as their personal property. City crews are mowing private properties that are in violation of the City Ordinance. The minimum charge is \$175/per hour and will be placed on property taxes levied in July. Also, the property owner can be cited for the violation.

Brush, tree limbs, grass clippings, etc. can be taken to the drop-off area on Eastern Ave. between E. Lincoln Ave. & Vanyea Rd. for City residents only. The site area is monitored by cameras and any misuse will be investigated.



Public Notice

Any citizen having experienced an overflow or backup of a sewage disposal or storm water system must file a written claim with the City of Cheboygan within 45 days after the discovery or in the exercise of reasonable diligence should have been discovered. Failure to provide the required notice to the City Manager, 403 N. Huron St., PO Box 39, Cheboygan, MI 49721 will prevent recovery of damages.

City Marina & Public Restroom Information

The Cheboygan City Marina consists of over 800' of broad-side dockage at two dock sites on the west side of the Cheboygan River just south of the State Street Drawbridge. Interested boaters may make reservations for overnight docking through the D.N.R. web site at midnrreservations.com or by simply tying up along the Marina wall and a dock attendant will stop by morning, noon.

The Cheboygan City Marina provides restroom facilities along with water and power hook-ups for registered boaters. Fuel and pump out facilities are available at the County Marina at the mouth of the Cheboygan River and the Straits of Mackinac. Interested parties may contact the City of Cheboygan for more information at Cheboygan Public Safety at 231-627-4321; or Parks and Recreation at 231-627-2151.

In addition to personal checks, money orders, cashier's checks & cash, we now accept credit/debit cards. There is a 3% convenience fee, or a minimum of \$2.00, which will be added to all payments made using credit/debit cards. 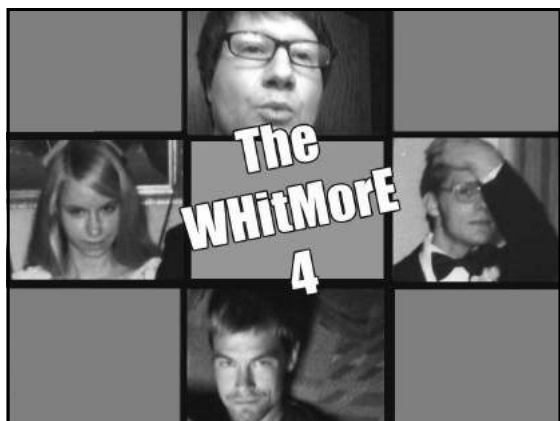

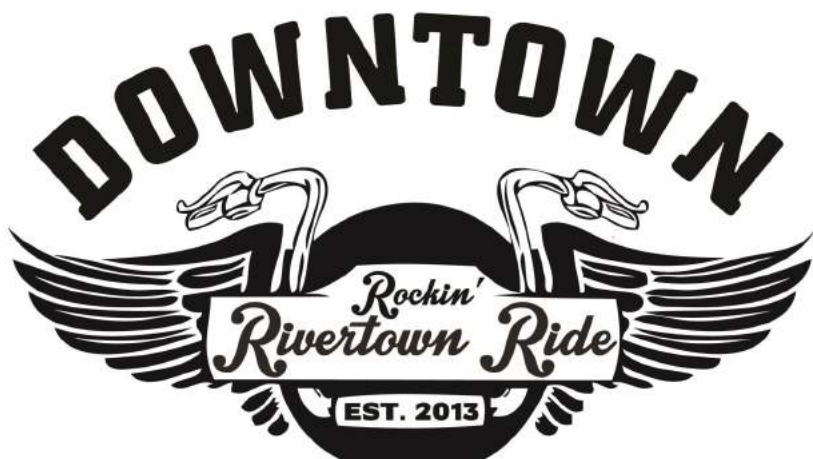

ORDINANCE REMINDERS FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY



ADDRESS NUMBER REQUIRED:

Chapter 98.62 & 98.63 of the City Ordinance states "All premises and/or mailboxes shall bear a distinctive street number in accordance with and as designated upon the street numbering maps on file in the offices of the City." Numbers should be at least 3 inches tall and reflective.

GARAGE SALES/YARD SALES:

- Yard or garage sales in which items are for sale to the public shall be no longer in duration than seven days within a 90-day period
- Yard Sale Signs are not to be placed in the public right of way or placed on any utility pole. They should be placed behind the curb, sidewalk or ditch line, with permission of the property owner.

BOAT & TRAILER STORAGE:

Chapter 154.136 of the City Ordinance states "all trailer coaches or boats owned by residents of the City and stored of their individuals lots shall not be stored within any required front or side yard." **MUST BE IN REAR YARD.**

GRASS AND NOXIOUS WEEDS:

Chapter 95.04 of the City Ordinance "No person occupying any premises, and no person owning any unoccupied premises shall permit or maintain on any such premises any growth of noxious weeds nor any growth of grass or other rank vegetation to a greater height than five inches on the average; nor any accumulation of dead weeds, grass or brush. Lawns shall be cut (grass can be no higher than five inches) and maintained 50 feet from the property line in developed areas, whether or not the same is occupied, and of a primary business structure." Cutting by the City is **\$175.00 per hour** and placed on the tax roll.

UNLICENSED/INOPERABLE MOTOR VEHICLES:

Chapter 94.02 of the City Ordinance states that "Any motor vehicle parked on your property in the City must be in operating condition and be licensed and insured for use in accordance with the requirements of the Michigan Vehicle Code" Vehicles not being used for original intended purpose **are in violation.**

TRASH PICKUP:

Chapter 95.02 prohibits "The placing of garbage containers, dumpsters or trash receptacles in a public right-of-way except on collection day." Placing furniture or other items out for trash pickup is not allowed except on trash day and must be prearranged for pickup with your trash company. Trash is to be in approved containers (metal or plastic) not just trash bags that can be torn apart by animals and containers must be removed from the right-of-way after trash is picked up at the end of the day.

NOISE:

Chapter 95.03 prohibits "The playing of any radio, television set, phonograph or any musical instrument in such a manner or such volume, particularly during the hours between 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. or any time or place so to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort, or repose of person in any office or any dwelling, hotel or other type of residence, or of any persons in the vicinity; Yelling, shouting, hooting, whistling, or singing or the making of any other loud noise on the public streets between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. or the making of any such noise at any time so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort, or repose of persons."

FIREWORKS:

Chapter 130.03 prohibits "The Fire, discharge, display or possess any Fireworks except of the type permitted by state law." No fireworks are to be discharged between the hours of 1:00 am and 8:00 am; fireworks are only permitted to be discharged on the day before a national holiday, the day of the national holiday, and the day after a national holiday. A person must be at least 18 years of age to purchase, acquire or obtain any legal fireworks. Michigan Fireworks Safety Act 256 of 2011 can be found on the complied laws website at Michigan.gov and the City of Cheboygan Website under City Ordinances Chapter 95.03, Noise Nuisance at www.cheboygan.org.

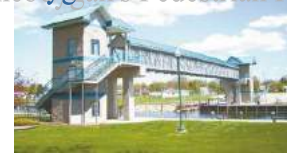
BLIGHT: Chapter 95.06 states that "It shall be unlawful for any person to keep or maintain a garish exterior upon any vacant structure, building, dwelling, garage, or outbuilding, factory shop, store, or warehouse..." "All exterior property areas shall be properly maintained in a clean and sanitary condition, free from debris, brush, severed tree limbs, rubbish or garbage, physical hazards, rodent harborage and infestation; storage or placement of junk refuse or other objects, including, but not limited to, campers, trailers, lawnmowers, snowmobiles, tractors, motorcycles, boats, and others items not having been used recently for their original intended purpose in the right-of-way, yard, front porch or outside area exposed to the view of neighbors or the general public is prohibited, unless a temporary permit is issued by the City Manager."
