

WATCH OUT FOR SNOWPLOW TRUCKS

While driving along City streets this winter, please be extra cautious when encountered by snowplow trucks during the course of their snow clearing activities. Be sure not to follow or park too close behind a plow truck in operation, as they often are required to back up. Operators have difficulty seeing what may be directly behind the vehicle. Parents should be aware that during winter storm events, which cause school closings, snowplows are busy clearing streets and opening them to traffic as quickly as possible after the storm. Due to school closings, many children are out & about entertaining themselves and enjoying a day off from school.

Parents should be aware of the snow plowing activities and be sure children are kept away from streets and roadsides. Also, please do not allow your children to build snow forts near the streets.

PAYMENT OF YOUR PROPERTY TAX BILLS

Your tax bill that was issued July 1, 2019 is due and payable at the City Hall on or before February 28, 2020 with a 3% penalty. Additional penalties, fees, etc. will be added by the County of Cheboygan on March 1, 2020. Your tax bill that was issued December 1, 2019 is due and payable without penalty at the City Hall on or before February 14, 2020. If payment is made February 15^{h} through February 28, 2020, it is made at the City Hall with a 3% penalty assessed. We accept postmarked payments (February 14) as being on time and not subject to penalty.

[City offices are only open Monday through Friday] Any payments after February 28, 2020 must be made at the County Treasurer's Office in the County Building. Personal property taxes are payable only at the City Hall.

WATER/SEWER BILLINGS

Since meters cannot be read in the winter months, your next two bills will be estimated based on the previous usage bill, which had actual meter reads.

RENTAL PROPERTIES

All owners of rental properties are reminded to notify the Utility Billing Dept. at 627-3592 of any tenant changes so that final bills can be calculated. ALSO, in order for the billing to be in the tenant's name, a **\$250.00** deposit is required from the tenant, pursuant to policy set by the City Council. This deposit is kept in a separate account until the tenant moves. It can then be used on the final bill or returned to the tenant if there is nothing owing on the final bill.

SNOWMOBILE PERMITS/ROUTES



Snowmobile permits may be obtained at the Dept. of Public Safety after November 1. There is no charge for a permit. Snowmobiles will be permitted only on designated streets, trails, and the most direct route from your residence to the nearest designated street or trail, **by permit**. Operation of snowmobiles is prohibited on City sidewalks except where designated (South Main Street, Taylor Street to City limits & from the Lincoln Avenue Bridge to Huron Street - both sides). The following streets are approved for snowmobiles without a permit: W. State St. from MDNRE Trail to Huron St.; Huron St. from W. First St. to Court St.; Division St. from MDNR Trail to Water St., Pine St. from Huron St. to Boathouse lot; Taylor St. from MDNRE Trail to Main St.; Water St. to E. State St. (northbound only: one-way from Elm St. to Division St.; Court St. from MDNRE Trail to Huron St.; N. Huron St. from W. State St. to W. First St. from N. Huron St. to Dresser St.; & Dresser St. from intersection of W. First St. to W. State St. (Maps are available at Chamber Commerce, motels/hotels, City Hall & Department of Public Safety and on the trails.) *CAUTION TO 4-WHEELERS & DIRT BIKE OPERATORS: Michigan Law does not permit operation of these vehicles on designated snowmobile trails*.

Persons plowing or blowing snow <u>cannot</u> plow snow in the roadway or right-of-way. Depositing of snow across roadways requires permission of neighboring or adjacent property owners.



NO ALL NIGHT PARKING ON CITY STREETS AND IN RIGHTS-OF-WAYS

To allow for efficient snow removal, no overnight parking is allowed on City streets or alleys from November 1 until April 1 during the hours of 2:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. This applies regardless of snowfall and violators will be ticketed. Also, parking is no longer allowed overnight in the City street rights-of-way, which is the area between the sidewalk and the curb. This applies even if there is no curbing and/or sidewalk. Tickets will also be issued for this violation. Particular problem areas are "C", "D" and "E" Streets, as well as others on the east and west sides. ORV/ATV ORDINANCE

The City's ORV/ATV Ordinance allows people to operate an ORV/ATV on certain designated streets. The streets are published in the Ordinance, which is available online at <u>www.cheboygan.org</u>, at the City Hall or the Department of Public Safety. Most of the City streets coming into the City are permitted on the east and west sides with the exception that at no time are ORVs/ATVs allowed on Mackinaw Avenue and State Street (U.S. 23) or Main Street (M-27). Residents who wish to ride an ORV/ATV but who are not located on a designated street must get a free permit from the Department of Public Safety, which will state the most direct route from the operator's residence to a designated street. At no time are you allowed to operate an ORV/ATV on the M-DNR Snowmobile Trail. If you have any questions, please stop in or contact the Department of Public Safety at 627-4321 between the hours of 8:00 am to 4:00 p.m., Monday-Friday.

ANIMAL CONTROL

Chapter 90, Sections 90.08 and 90.22 of the City Ordinance require that all persons **walk their dogs on leashes** and have them under control and that they clean up all manure deposited or accumulated upon any street, sidewalk, gutter, alley or private property.





BURNING PERMITS

All property owners, whether business or residential, are **required to obtain** a burning permit from the City of Cheboygan before open burning of any type is permitted. This includes small piles of brush, grass or leaves. Burning in burning barrels is also restricted and persons wishing to do so must obtain permission through the Cheboygan Department of Public Safety/Police or Fire Division (627-4321). Fines for violation of this Ordinance can amount to \$500.00 or more.



FIRE EXTINQUISHERS: Dry chemical fire extinguishers can be refilled at CarQuest, 122 S. Main St., Cheboygan (627-5691).

SNOW & ICE REMOVAL FROM SIDEWALK REQUIRED

The owners of any property in certain areas are required by City Ordinance to keep sidewalks clear of snow and ice. The areas which are included in the snow & ice removal Ordinance are listed as follows:



Huron Street from Mackinaw Avenue to Locust Street Main Street from First Street to the South City Limits Water Street from State Street to Elm Street Mackinaw Avenue from Clinton Street to Main Street State Street from Huron Street to "F" Street Backus Street from Huron Street to Main Street Division Street from Dresser Street to Water Street Elm Street from Huron Street to Water Street Pine Street from Huron Street to Main Street Locust Street from Huron Street to Main Street



These sidewalks have been identified as high foot traffic areas and, as such, removal of snow & ice is required by Ordinance in order to assure public safety and limit property owner and public liability. The City of Cheboygan does provide snow removal services within this area, but this does not dismiss the requirement of the property owner to be sure that the sidewalk is clear in the event that the City is unable to keep the sidewalks clear in a timely manner. **The snow & ice removal Ordinance provides for fines in the event a property owner is in non-compliance**. and also provides for exceptions to these provisions with regard to property that is leased. **DO NOT PILE SNOW**

IN RIGHT-OF-WAY, ON SIDEWALKS OR IN BERM AREA (BETWEEN CURB & SIDEWALK). For more information regarding the snow & ice removal Ordinance, you may call the Department of Public Safety at 231-627-4321.

BLIGHT: Chapter 95.06 states that "It shall be unlawful for any person to keep or maintain a garish exterior upon any vacant structure, building, dwelling, garage, or outbuilding, factory shop, store, or warehouse..." "All exterior property areas shall be properly maintained in a clean and sanitary condition, free from debris, brush, severed tree limbs, rubbish or garbage, physical hazards, rodent harborage and infestation; storage or placement of junk refuse or other objects, including, but not limited to, campers, trailers, lawnmowers, snowmobiles, tractors, motorcycles, boats, and others items not having been used recently for their original intended purpose in the right-of-way, yard, front porch or outside area exposed to the view of neighbors or the general public is prohibited, unless a temporary permit is issued by the City Manager."

PROPERTY INSPECTIONS CONTINUE

The City of Cheboygan is in the process of updating all property record cards over the course of the next few years. Someone may be stopping at your property to update the property record card this year or in the near future. The inspection includes a complete re-measuring of the land improvements along with listing the building improvements. Also, digital images will be taken for the record. Some questions such as how many bedrooms, bathrooms and interior finish may be asked if you are home. Access to your home is not asked for or required for this project.

DUMPSTER PERMITS: Chapter 95.02, paragraph 12, of the City Ordinance prohibits dumpsters at single family residences unless a TEMPORARY PERMIT is issued by the Director of Public Safety or City Manager. Permits are free and may be picked up at the Cheboygan Department of Public Safety M-Th 9:30 am-2:30pm and Friday 9:30 am-1:30 pm.
